IN ORDER TO FULFILL OUR DUTY TO OUTSIDERS WE MUST REMEMBER GOD'S MERCY TO US

I. The Christian's Duty To Outsiders (3:1-2):

- A) To be submissive and obedient to our earthly rulers and authorities.
- B) To be ready to do every kind of good work.
- C) To seek peace in our relationships in society:
 - 1. by contributing nothing which is provoking or contentious.
 - 2. by contributing that which is productive and considerate.

II. The Importance Of The Christian's Duty To Outsiders (3:1a):

- A) Evident in the priority Paul and Titus gave to these commands.
- B) Evident in the people's ongoing need to hear these commands.

III. The Rationale For The Christian's Duty To Outsiders (3:3-5a):

- A) We ourselves once were what outsiders now are.
- B) We were saved and changed by God's mercy, not by our works.
- C) God's goodness appeared when he showed us mercy and grace.
- D) God's goodness will appear in us when we show mercy and grace.
