The Letters to the Churches Part 1

SUMMARY STATEMENT

The Revelation of John is a Christocentric book that shows us the pattern of this world from Christ's first coming to His second coming.

John wants us to see the spiritual realities around us, to recognize the dangers that face us, and to know that God is going to win.

Revelation calls us, then, to wisdom, to perseverance, and to worship.





TO THE CHURCH IN EPHESUS

The Danger of Loving Doctrine

REVELATION 2:1-4 Danger: they stopped loving Christ + each other instead, they loved doctrine

How did they get here: they fought a long, hard battle with false, Christ-dishonoring doctrine



Holding right doctrine was good, BUT they came to love doctrine instead of

loving Christ, they came to love being right instead of loving Christ



- a protecting relationship Christ the guardian of the church


The church in Ephesus forgot that they weren't the protectors of the church – they got caught up in winning the battle over doctrine and made the battle supreme and forgot that doctrine was about loving Christ who loved them first

LOVING DOCTRINE INSTEAD OF CHRIST

- A danger that appears when we are faced with increasingly aggressive false doctrine around us
- A danger that could look like:
 - Loving the victory ("being right"), not loving those with whom we disagree
 - Growing increasingly defined by our pet doctrines
 - Looking down on others who don't share all of our particular convictions
 - An unending search for "like-mindedness"
 - A heart increasingly focused on being proved right, and decreasingly focused on loving Christ and others

LOVING DOCTRINE INSTEAD OF CHRIST

- How do we guard ourselves from this?
 - Remember and remind each other of Christ's love and protection – He is the victor, not us
 - Remember and remind each other that our goal is Christ, not victory in this world
 - Love doctrine for how it drives your love for Christ, not for how it proves you right
 - Expend more energy in loving others in Christ than proving yourself right about Christ

FALLING AWAY DUE TO PERSECUTION

- A danger that appears when the world increasingly hates us and wants to remove or defang us
- A danger that could look like:
 - Loving something in this world (your family, your land, your house, ...) and being afraid/unwilling to lose it
 - A desire to hide your affiliation with Christ to make life easier
 - Being willing to compromise the truths of Scripture, the truths of Christ, to conform to the desires or decrees of this world

FALLING AWAY DUE TO PERSECUTION

- How do we guard ourselves from this?
 - Remember and remind each other that Christ has won the final victory and nothing in this world can defeat us
 - Keep our eyes on the riches of Christ and set aside the "wealth" of this world
 - Challenge each other when love for the things of this world creeps in and support each other when living in Christ proves costly
 - Call each other to value the commands of Scripture more than the decrees of this world

WHAT IS THE MESSAGE OF REVELATION?

Revelation tells us that ⁽¹⁾ the <u>world</u> is the <u>enemy</u> of God and ⁽²⁾ that God <u>wins</u>.

WHAT IS THE CALL OF REVELATION?

Revelation call us to ⁽¹⁾ keep following Christ and ⁽²⁾ to worship Him forever.

WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF REVELATION?

To ⁽¹⁾ show us the truth of Jesus, ⁽²⁾ call us to trust in Jesus' victory, and ⁽³⁾ call us to keep following Jesus.

WHAT TRUTHS ARE CENTRAL TO REVELATION?

Revelation is based on ⁽¹⁾ God's sovereignty, ⁽²⁾ God's gospel, ⁽³⁾ God's power, and ⁽⁴⁾ God's victory.

WHERE DO WE NEED TO KEEP OUR EYES WHEN WE HAVE TROUBLE IN THIS WORLD?

We must keep our eyes on the glory and the <u>authority</u> of <u>Jesus</u> and <u>know</u> that He is going to <u>win</u>.

HOW DO WE DEFEAT THE DANGERS OF THIS WORLD?

By keeping our eyes on Christ, following His command, and loving His promise.
