WE APPROACH THE LORD

Prelude Call to Worship

These verses set forth the truths that worship is (in part) a response to salvation and involves exulting in the glory of God.

Psalm 149:1-5 ESV

 - his praise in the assembly of the godly!
- ² Let Israel be glad in his Maker;
 - let the children of Zion rejoice in their King!
- 3 Let them praise his name with dancing, making melody to him with tambourine and lyre!
- ⁴ For the LORD takes pleasure in his people; he adorns the humble with salvation.
- Let the godly exult in glory; let them sing for joy on their beds.

Pagan worship contains "abominable" elements because it is inspired by selfishness and incited by Satan, who hates mankind as the image of God.

Deuteronomy 12:29-32 ESV

"When the LORD your God cuts off before you the nations whom you go in to dispossess, and you dispossess them and dwell in their land, ³⁰ take care that you be not ensnared to follow them, after they have been destroyed before you, and that you do not inquire about their gods, saying, 'How did these nations serve their gods?that I also may do the same.' ³¹ You shall not worship the LORD your God in that way, for every abominable thing that the LORD hates they have done for their gods, for they even burn their sons and their daughters in the fire to their gods.

³² "Everything that I command you, you shall be careful to do. You shall not add to it or take from it."

Silent Confession of Sin Corporate Confession of Sin

We confess here both sins of omission and commission in reference to God's laws, and pray that we might by His grace live lives which glorify Him, which is what God's law is all about.

Almighty and most merciful Father; We have erred and strayed from Your ways like lost sheep. We have followed too much the devices and desires of our own hearts. We have offended against Your holy laws. We have left undone those things which we ought to have done; And we have done those things which we ought not to have done; And there is no health in us. O Lord, have mercy upon us, miserable offenders. Spare those, O God, who confess their faults. Restore those who are penitent; According to Your promises declared unto mankind in Christ Jesus our Lord. And grant, O merciful Father, for His sake; That we may hereafter live a godly, righteous, and sober life; To the glory of Your holy name. Amen.

Assurance of Pardoning Grace

God has done what the Law by itself could not do, so that we might be conformed to the Law. The Law thus drives us to Christ, who then drives us back to the Law. Contrary to much theological opinion, Law is integral to the Gospel.

Romans 8:1-4 ESV

There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. ² For the law of the Spirit of life has set you free in Christ Jesus from the law of sin and death. ³ For God has done what the law, weakened by the flesh, could not do. By sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh and for sin, he condemned sin in the flesh, ⁴ in order that the righteous requirement of the law might be fulfilled in us, who walk not according to the flesh but according to the Spirit.

Leader: This is the gospel. Congregation: Hallelujah!

Distribution of Elements

Because we believe that wine was used in the Last Supper and is thus more in accord with the fullness of symbolism intended by God in the Lord's Supper, we offer wine and encourage those who take part in Communion to take this. For those with conscientious convictions against the use of wine, however, we offer the option of grape juice, which is contained in the inner circle of the communion trays. The cups containing wine are in the outer circles of the trays.
