ORDER OF WORSHIP

Thank you for joining us this morning! At Christ the King, our worship is a divine-human dialogue, in accordance with Scriptural example and precedent, alternatively hearing God's Word and responding in prayer, song, or meditation. The boxes throughout the bulletin were written to aid each worshipper in thoughtful and meaningful participation in this dialogue. Please prepare your heart by reading through the bulletin, praying for those leading and worshipping around you, and silencing all communication devices.

We encourage parents to involve children as soon as possible in the worship service. In consideration of other worshippers, we request parents with children not yet ready for unobtrusive participation in worship to utilize the nursery or, if necessary, the cry room. A nursery is available for children ages 3 months to 3 years during all Sunday morning activities.

Prelude

Call to Worship

God's people are directed in these words to declare God's glory and tell of His salvation among the nations. This refers to both our public worship and our evangelism, and both are linked, as we worship God when we evangelize and our worship feeds our evangelism.

* Reading from the Law

It is tempting to respond to the slander of the world toward Christians with angry retaliation, when God's Word enjoins us rather to a recommitment to godly living, putting those who slander to shame and refuting their claims without a word by the obvious character of our lives. Is this the way we respond to the world's opposition, or is there all too often a grain (at least!) of truth in their characterizations?

Deuteronomy 4:5-8; I Peter 2:12 ESV

5 See, I have taught you statutes and rules, as the Lord my God commanded me, that you should do them in the land that you are entering to take possession of it. 6 Keep them and do them, for that will be your wisdom and your understanding in the sight of the peoples, who, when they hear all these statutes, will say, 'Surely this great nation is a wise and understanding people.' 7 For what great nation is there that has a god so near to it as the Lord our God is to us, whenever we call upon him? 8 And what great nation is there, that has statutes and rules so righteous as all this law that I set before you today? 12 Keep your conduct among the Gentiles honorable, so that when they speak against you as evildoers, they may see your good deeds and glorify God on the day of visitation.

Silent Confession of Sin

Corporate Confession of Sin

In our confession, today we concentrate on our response to the world's opposition, hostility, and persecution, and our failure through it to witness to the reality of the God who is good even to those who hate Him, and whose kindness leads people to repentance.

Corporate Confession: Lord of the Harvest, who has demonstrated your love for all mankind by calling people from every tongue, language, people, and nation to bear your Name, we confess that we have often taken that Name in vain, misrepresenting You before those who have among them people You desire to call to yourself through our witness. We have reacted to persecution with anger and malice rather than love, returning evil for evil, in direct disobedience to your command to be holy and to let our light shine to the world. We have focused more on our comfort and the resentment which the deprivation of it can generate, rather than on your purpose for the world and our mission to it. O Merciful Father, we despise our shortsighted and self-centered approach to life, and pray that You would not only forgive us, but also enable us to look beyond our meager vision for our lives to that noble role for which You have prepared and to which You have called us, that we might one day acknowledge your wisdom and our privilege in your making us the means whereby sinners come to You and are redeemed, to the praise of your glorious grace, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Assurance of Pardoning Grace

This assurance passage, drawn from the verses immediately preceding part of today's law Scripture, points us to the basis upon which we build our ability to be holy, which is that God has definitively saved us and made us a holy people.

I Peter 2:9, 10 ESV

9 But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for his own possession, that you may proclaim the excellencies of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. 10 Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy.

This wonderful hymn of assurance allows us to sing in one verse of the formula for overcoming Satan's opposition: in the words of Revelation, we overcome him "by the blood of the Lamb and the word of our testimony." This is our victory.

Prayers of Intercession

Sermon

"The Character of Gospel Opposition" (Rev. Mike Biggs)

* Acts 21:27-36 ESV

27 When the seven days were almost completed, the Jews from Asia, seeing him in the temple, stirred up the whole crowd and laid hands on him, 28 crying out, "Men of Israel, help! This is the man who is teaching everyone everywhere against the people and the law and this place. Moreover, he even brought Greeks into the temple and has defiled this holy place." 29 For they had previously seen Trophimus the Ephesian with him in the city, and they supposed that Paul had brought him into the temple. 30 Then all the city was stirred up, and the people ran together. They seized Paul and dragged him out of the temple, and at once the gates were shut. 31 And as they were seeking to kill him, word came to the tribune of the cohort that all Jerusalem was in confusion. 32 He at once took soldiers and centurions and ran down to them. And when they saw the tribune and the soldiers, they stopped beating Paul. 33 Then the tribune came up and arrested him and ordered him to be bound with two chains. He inquired who he was and what he had done. 34 Some in the

crowd were shouting one thing, some another. And as he could not learn the facts because of the uproar, he ordered him to be brought into the barracks. 35 And when he came to the steps, he was actually carried by the soldiers because of the violence of the crowd, 36 for the mob of the people followed, crying out, "Away with him!"

Distribution of Elements

Because we believe that wine was used in the Last Supper and is thus more in accord with the fullness of symbolism intended by God in the Lord's Supper, we offer wine and encourage those who take part in Communion to take this. For those with conscientious convictions against the use of wine, however, we offer the option of grape juice, which is contained in the inner circle of the communion trays. The cups containing wine are in the outer circles of the trays.
