Why the World Hates Christians pt 3

John 15:18-25 (NKJV)

¹⁸ "If the world hates you, you know that it hated Me before it hated you. 19 If you were of the world, the world would love its own. Yet because you are not of the world, but I chose you out of the world, therefore the world hates you. ²⁰ Remember the word that I said to you, 'A servant is not greater than his master.' If they persecuted Me, they will also persecute you. If they kept My word, they will keep yours also. ²¹ But all these things they will do to you for My name's sake, because they do not know Him who sent Me. ²² If I had not come and spoken to them, they would have no sin, but now they have no excuse for their sin. 23 He who hates Me hates My Father also. 24 If I had not done among them the works which no one else did, they would have no sin; but now they have seen and also hated both Me and My Father. ²⁵ But *this happened* that the word might be fulfilled which is written in their law, 'They hated Me without a cause.'

Introduction

When we were in Kenya last year, I had the privilege to meet Noel Night. A former South Sudanese Pastor who had been beaten nearly to death for his opposition to the injustices perpetrated by the government. When I met him. he had made remarkable progress back from almost sure death.

To understand what had happened, you need a little context. South Sudan was created through a peaceful referendum in 2011. But over the next 2 years, serious ideological differences developed between President Salvar Kir and the former Vice President Rieck Machar. These differences would eventually spill out in violence and turmoil and still do to this date. It developed into a War of political and tribal powers.

There are 2 major Tribes, the Dinka and Nuer and then there are 64 minority tribes. Dinka is the largest Tribe and is were the President Kir is from.

The turmoil finally reached an apex when the Former Vice President was ejected from the country by military force from orders of the President.

On December 10th 2017, Noel was on way home from church. He had walked about half way, when a black Toyota with dark tented windows stopped about 30 Meters ahead. As he walked by, 2 men got out of the vehicle, with guns and ask if he was Noel Night. He replied yes and they then said he was under arrest. They would say why and they would say who they were.

They ordered Noel into the vehicle, He refused. At that moment he heard one of the men inside the vehicle cocking his gun and the other 2 did the same.

He said, "I was terrified".

They hit me in the back as I got in the vehicle which made me fall hard inside. After inside, I was hit in the head with the back of a rifle and they immediately tied my legs and hands behind my back, blindfolded me and made me lie face down. The 2 men placed their heavy boots on me and continued to beat me with the guns all over my body.

When we reach the destination, they threw me in a cell and started beating me again, although now it was much worse. I was still blindfolded as the continued with the beatings. My mouth and nose bled profusely. My neck, throat, ribs and back

severely swollen. I was then moved to what I called the torture chamber. All my clothes except my underwear where removed.

The sat me in a metal chair that clamped my neck, hands and legs. I remained there for 2 days as they repeatedly tortured me with beatings, slaps, fist, kicks from sticks and guns.

It was at this point that they started asking me where I was working. Noel said he was a pastor of a church in Juba. They rejected what he said and continued with the beatings all night.

At 4 am, another man came in and said that if Noel did not tell them where he was working, or they would kill him.

He was so severely beaten, causing him to be tired, frustrated and depressed that He told them that they could go ahead and kill him. He requested that if they do it, to kill him by the road and leave his body to be found by family members.

The man left and then about 8 am, another man comes and slaps him twice and orders him to give the information they requested because his boss had come to get it.

Noel kept quiet. He ask 5 more times, yet Noel said nothing.

The Boss came then and told Noel that he had been apprehended because he was preaching against the injustices of the government and for their killing of rebels in the St. Andrew Parish.

I spoke out when the government soldiers came to my home village and killed 173 people including my mother, brother and sister in 3 hours time.

Noel says to this day, he feels disturbed at a sudden bang or loud noises. He's uncomfortable when a vehicle stops behind him or in front of him. He still has fear of being arrest anytime he is a church.

His wife suffered untold amounts of bad treatment while hiding in the bush with their children.

When I left Kenya, we gave what monies we had left to help feed his family. I gave him my books, my Bible, all my clothes except enough for me to get back and the pharmacy of medication my wife had pack for our trip.

He was a pastor and he simply spoke out against what was obviously wrong.

When he shared his story with me, I could not help but think of

His is one of 100s of stories like this that speak to the reality of persecution for righteousness sake.

Ours is world that has the devil as its God and evil as its good.

We should always pray to remain faithful but never be shocked when the world hates us.

These verses speak of personal responsibility and that there Hatred of Christ and of God is that much more severe due to the Revelation of Christ.

There are 3 things or events that make unbelievers much more responsible for there Hatred of Christ.

- 1. His Incarnation
- 2. His Proclamation
- 3. His Manifestation

First, some grammatical explanation

β) Determined as Unfulfilled. In this somewhat difficult condition only past tenses of the ind. occur. The premise is assumed to be contrary to fact. The thing in itself may be true, but it is *treated* as untrue. Here again the condition has only to do with the *statement*, not with the actual fact. - 22. If it were true, that I had not come and spoken to them, they would have not sin.
- 24. If it were true, I had not done the works which no one else did, then they would have no sin. But the emphasis of the verses are that

I did come

I did speak

I did work

and because I did, your responsible for your sin of rejection and hatred....even more so.

Each point of these verses magnifies the culpability of the sinner for his hatred of Christ and God.

The mission was to save, not judge... but the fact that grace is given means sin is judged.

When one rejects Jesus salvation, he brings condemnation on himself.

The Goal of the 1st coming was to save.

judgments occur by default, due to rejection of Jesus.

The Goal of the coming is Judgment.

That is why is says

v. 39 "For (Εἰς, into with a result) judgment I have come into this world,

When light shows up, darkness scatters. These natural reactions of sinners to light occur when Jesus comes.

³⁹ And Jesus said, "For (Είς, into with a result) judgment I have come into this world, that those who do not see may see, and that those who see may be made blind."

Let me render what the verse is saying.

"Jesus has by coming into the world, forgiven the sins (made to see) of those who are willing to admit they are sinners (blind)

And those who believe they are righteous and see and have no sin are condemned and made blind.

⁴⁰ Then *some* of the Pharisees who were with Him heard these words, and said to Him, "Are we blind also?"

Are we condemned and sinners also???

⁴¹ Jesus said to them, "If you were blind, you would have no sin; but now you say, 'We see.' Therefore your sin remains.

"If you were willing to admit your sin and need for Christ, you would be forgiven and have no sin. But since you still say we are righteous and have no need for Christ Your sin is unforgiven!!!"

As John Calvin explained,

He ...who,(is) aware of his own blindness, seeks a remedy to cure his disease. In this way the meaning (of this text) will be, "If you would acknowledge your disease, it would not be altogether incurable; but now because you think that you are in perfect health, you continue in a desperate state." He ... means that the disease may easily be cured, when it is truly felt; because, when a *blind* man is desirous to obtain deliverance, God is ready to assist him; but they who, insensible to their diseases, despise the grace of God, are incurable. (Commentary on the Cospel According to John, translated by

The reality of these verse is sobering. The magnification of sin due to the exposure to light is staggering.

The more you know the more accountable you are. The more you see the more responsible you are.

The greatest times of Revelation that may bring regeneration or Reformation or Revival also bring with it a great wait fo responsibility.

There has never been a time historically when more information and Revelation about God has been given than during the time of the incarnation of Christ.

This even supersedes the time of Adam and Eve walking with God in the Garden before the fall.

Although God was with them, miracles had ceased.

The Creative work had finished. They were witness to God, and heard his word, but had not witnessed miracles.

Jesus however, comes and takes on human flesh, and is the image of the invisible God, who is the express image of His Person. He comes speaking the words and wisdom of God and doing miracles, signs and wonders. Profound supernatural, creative, life giving miracles, with no explanation except God. So those who hate Christ, hate him at great cost. Greater than many who never saw, or never heard or never read the Word's of God.

Matthew 11:20-24 (NKJV)

____The reason the world hates Christians is because they hate the God of the Bible which means they hate Jesus Christ and those who identify with him.

What ever attitude you have toward Christ, you have toward God.

Jesus repeatedly emphasized the truth that the one who hates Him hates the Father also. To those

who were outraged because He called God His Father,

Jesus replied, "He who does not honor the Son does not honor the Father who sent Him" (John 5:23).

John 7:28 records that "Jesus cried out in the temple, teaching and saying, 'You both know Me and know where I am from; and I have not come of Myself, but He who sent Me is true, whom you do not know.'"

In John 8:19 He said to His Jewish opponents, "You know neither Me nor My Father; if you knew Me, you would know My Father also."

In verse 42 He added, "If God were your Father, you would love Me, for I proceeded forth and have come from God, for I have not even come on My own initiative, but He sent Me."

Later He said, "If I glorify Myself, My glory is nothing; it is My Father who glorifies Me, of whom you say, 'He is our God'; and you have not come to know Him" (John 8:54–55).

After warning the disciples that they would be persecuted, Jesus said of their persecutors, "These things they will do because they have not known the Father or Me" (John 16:3).

He prayed to the Father, "O righteous Father, although the world has not known You, yet I have known You" (John 17:25).

Echoing the Lord's words, John wrote in his first epistle, "Whoever denies the Son does not have the Father" (1 John 2:23).

The truth is that if men had understood who Jesus was, "they would not have crucified the Lord of glory" (1 Cor. 2:8).

The world's hatred of Jesus, though reprehensible and inexcusable, was not outside of God's sovereign plan. They have done this, Jesus declared, to fulfill the word that is written in their Law, "They hated Me without a cause." The Lord quoted from two Davidic psalms, 35:19 and 69:4. His point is that if David, a mere man,

could be so hated by his enemies, how much more the sinless Son of God? The world hated Jesus because He exposed their sin and confronted them with the reality of who He is. But in light of Jesus' words and works, there was and is no valid **cause** to hate Him. That the world continues to do so graphically reveals the vileness of sin.

²⁷ "For truly against Your holy Servant Jesus, whom You anointed, both Herod and Pontius Pilate, with the Gentiles and the people of Israel, were gathered together ²⁸ to do whatever Your hand and Your purpose determined before to be done.
