- 3. When your spirit, or communion with God, is the epicenter of your life do you notice a difference in what or whom you desire? Differences in your thought life? Higher productivity, creativity and problem solving ability?
- 4. Can you be so "heavenly-minded" that you are no earthly good? Explain.
- 5. What part of you is most in charge, most often?
- 6. Are you long overdue for a move of the Holy Spirit in your personal life? If so, why?
