

Passage to Read for the Next Lesson – Revelation 12:1-9

Revelation 11:15-19

The sounding of the Seventh Trumpet has far reaching consequences. It releases the Seven Bowl Judgments found in Chapter 16. These are followed by the return of Christ in Chapter 19 to establish His kingdom.

The narrative of events goes -

- 1. The sounding of the Seventh Trumpet (Rev. 11:15)
- The announcement of the end (of the Seventieth Week of Daniel) (Rev. 11:15)
- 3. The ominous vision of the Heavenly Temple being opened. (Rev. 11:19)
- 4. The vision of the seven angels who will administer the Seven Bowl Judgments coming out of the Heavenly Temple. (Rev. 15:6)
- 5. The Seven Bowl Judgments (Rev. 16)

Between the vision of the Heavenly Temple being opened in 11:19 and the continuation of the narrative in 15:6 is a section of Revelation that introduces seven important personages of the Seventieth Week of Daniel. It's as if a pause button is pushed after 11:19, important background information is revealed in 12:1-15:5, and then the play button is pushed in 15:6.

Revelation 11:15

It's evident the Seventh Trumpet results in the return of Christ. These words tie the Seventh Trumpet to the Seven Bowl Judgments of Revelation 16. The glorious pronouncement found in this verse would be curiously unfulfilled if the Seven Bowl judgments to follow were not the Seventh Trumpet itself. Whatever happens because of the sounding of the Seventh Trumpet results in the destruction of every existing government of fallen humanity and its replacement by the Kingdom of Christ. (Daniel 2:44-45)

Revelation 11:16-18

The twenty-four elders join in and add to the praise in heaven that erupts at the sounding of the Seventh Trumpet. All that God has promised since the fall of humanity in Genesis 3 is about to be realized. The usurpers will be judged; the rightful Creator/Owner will reign.

Revelation 11:19

The Wilderness Tabernacle and Jewish Temples built on earth were made after the pattern of the true Heavenly Temple. (Exodus 25:9; 25:40; 26:30; Hebrews 8:1-6) This is the original Temple; what we call the Wilderness Tabernacle is really just the first earthly *model* of heaven itself. Now John sees the Heavenly Temple and into the Holy of Holies. What comes forth is revealed in 15:6.
