Lk.23:39-43

## I. Notice the utter obstinacy of sinful men against the Lord Jesus and the things of God, Lk.23:35-39

- A. Observe the breadth of this utter obstinacy: it is true of all classes of people. ("obstinacy" means unreasonably determined to have one's way; not yielding to reason or plea; stubborn.)
  - 1. The educated and knowledgeable the rulers, Lk.23:35b (chief priests, scribes, elders, rulers, Mt.27:41-43)
    - a. What they had seen: the countless miracles of Christ
    - b. What they had heard: 1) their own people say, Jn.7:31 > Isa.53:4; Matt.8:16, 17, 2) the Lord Jesus say, Jn.8:24
    - c. What they correctly understood, Jn.5:17, 18 Jesus is God.
    - d. What they said as they saw the Lord Jesus dying upon the cross, Lk.23:35b, Matt.27:42, 43 > chief priests, scribes and elders
  - 2. The common the soldiers > Lk.23:36, 37; Matt. 27:39 and the people > Lk.23:35a; Matt.27:39-40
    - a. What they had read, Lk.23:38
    - b. What they saw: a man claiming to be a king dying upon a cross like a convicted criminal.
    - c. What they said as they saw the Lord Jesus dying on the cross, Lk.23:37b
  - The criminal(s) the malefactor(s), Lk.23:39
    - a. What they heard: the deriding of their religious leaders, the mocking of the soldiers, Lk.23:35-37
    - b. What they saw: a man claiming to be God and a king dying just like they were.
    - c. What at least one of them said as they saw the Lord Jesus dying on the cross, Lk.23:39 (Matt.27:44; Mk.15:32)

# The Ever-Accessible Savior

Lk.23:39-43

- II. Notice the unexpected and incredible *grace* of God poured out upon an undeserving sinner, Lk.23:40-42.
  - A. Just when all seemed to be the darkest, something extraordinary happened.
  - B. Notice the 3 proofs of this criminal's repentance and saving faith.
    - 1. His reproof of wickedness, his hating it and forsaking it, Lk.23:40. (Repentance unto Eternal Life IS a saving grace, whereby a sinner out of a true sense of his/her sin and apprehension of the mercy of God in Christ, does with grief and hatred of his/her sin turn from it unto God, with full purpose of and endeavor after, new obedience.)
    - 2. His acknowledgement of his own sinfulness and the Lord Jesus' sinlessness, Lk.23:41 (See Phil.2:13; Matt.16:15-17)
    - 3. His manifested faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, Lk.23:42
      - a. We are hard pressed to find a more remarkable and striking example of true faith, than what we find in our text.
      - b. Notice how crystal clear must have been the spiritual eyes of this criminal's mind to behold:
        - 1) Life in death
        - 2) Exaltation in humiliation
        - 3) Glory in shame
        - 4) Victory in seeming defeat
        - 5) A kingdom in condemnation
      - c. **Truly** this criminal's repentance and faith can ONLY be ascribed to God's glorious, saving grace!!
- III. Notice the inconceivable readiness of God to quickly and kindly receive those who call upon Him with repentance and faith, 23:43.
  - A. In the midst of all the Lord Jesus' pain and suffering, He readily received this penitent sinner.
  - B. There can be no doubt that the Lord Jesus is prepared to admit into His kingdom all who call upon Him for salvation, Rom.10:13; Jn.6:37b. The Lord Jesus opened the gate of heaven for this criminal.

#### IV. Applications:

- A. <u>To Believers</u>: Be conformed to the image of Christ! Be accessible to sinners who come to you earnestly seeking the Savior for salvation! You cannot save them, nor assure them that they will go to Paradise after they die, BUT <u>you can point them to the One</u> who can. Be approachable like the Lord Jesus Christ!
- B. <u>To Unbelievers</u>: The Lord Jesus Christ still hears and responses positively to the prayer of penitent sinners! He is the Ever-Accessible Savior to those who call upon Him! Call upon Him today!

- II. Notice the unexpected and incredible *grace* of God poured out upon an undeserving sinner, Lk.23:40-42.
  - A. Just when all seemed to be the darkest, something extraordinary happened.
  - B. Notice the 3 proofs of this criminal's repentance and saving faith.
    - 1. His reproof of wickedness, his hating it and forsaking it, Lk.23:40. (Repentance unto Eternal Life IS a saving grace, whereby a sinner out of a true sense of his/her sin and apprehension of the mercy of God in Christ, does with grief and hatred of his/her sin turn from it unto God, with full purpose of and endeavor after, new obedience.)
    - 2. His acknowledgement of his own sinfulness and the Lord Jesus' sinlessness, Lk.23:41 (See Phil.2:13; Matt.16:15-17)
    - 3. His manifested faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, Lk.23:42
      - a. We are hard pressed to find a more remarkable and striking example of true faith, than what we find in our text.
      - b. Notice how crystal clear must have been the spiritual eyes of this criminal's mind to behold:
        - 1) Life in death
        - 2) Exaltation in humiliation
        - 3) Glory in shame
        - 4) Victory in seeming defeat
        - 5) A kingdom in condemnation
      - c. **Truly** this criminal's repentance and faith can ONLY be ascribed to God's glorious, saving grace!!
- III. Notice the inconceivable readiness of God to quickly and kindly receive those who call upon Him with repentance and faith, 23:43.
  - A. In the midst of all the Lord Jesus' pain and suffering, He readily received this penitent sinner.
  - B. There can be no doubt that the Lord Jesus is prepared to admit into His kingdom all who call upon Him for salvation, Rom.10:13; Jn.6:37b. The Lord Jesus opened the gate of heaven for this criminal.

#### IV. Applications:

- A. <u>To Believers</u>: Be conformed to the image of Christ! Be accessible to sinners who come to you earnestly seeking the Savior for salvation! You cannot save them, nor assure them that they will go to Paradise after they die, BUT <u>you can point them to the One</u> who can. Be approachable like the Lord Jesus Christ!
- B. <u>To Unbelievers</u>: The Lord Jesus Christ still hears and responses positively to the prayer of penitent sinners! He is the Ever-Accessible Savior to those who call up Him! Call upon Him today!
