# The Godly Example of Timothy

CONCLUSION: Christ does not call us to be doormats whom other people can walk all over. But He does call us to abandon our selfish ambition that both traps us and keeps us from truly loving others. Only through serving Him whole-heartedly are we free to love and be loved as we truly are in Christ—Children of God.

#### **Matthew 6:31-33**

"Therefore do not be anxious, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' For the Gentiles seek after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them all. But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you."

#### First Corinthians 4:14-21

I do not write these things to make you ashamed, but to admonish you as my beloved children. For though you have countless guides in Christ, you do not have many fathers. For I became your father in Christ Jesus through the gospel. I urge you, then, be imitators of me. That is why I sent you Timothy, my beloved and faithful child in the Lord, to remind you of my ways in Christ, as I teach them everywhere in every church. Some are arrogant, as though I were not coming to you. But I will come to you soon, if the Lord wills, and I will find out not the talk of these arrogant people but their power. For the kingdom of God does not consist in talk but in power. What do you wish? Shall I come to you with a rod, or with love in a spirit of gentleness?

## First Corinthians 10:31-11:1

So, whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God. Give no offense to Jews or to Greeks or to the church of God, just as I try to please everyone in everything I do, not seeking my own advantage, but that of many, that they may be saved. Be imitators of me, as I am of Christ.

# **Second Timothy 2:1-6**

You then, my child, be strengthened by the grace that is in Christ Jesus, and what you have heard from me in the presence of many witnesses entrust to faithful men, who will be able to teach others also. Share in suffering as a good soldier of Christ Jesus. No soldier gets entangled in civilian pursuits, *since his aim is to please the one who enlisted him*. An athlete is not crowned unless he competes according to the rules. It is the hard-working farmer who ought to have the first share of the crops.

## Matthew 16:24-28

Then Jesus told his disciples, "If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. For whoever would save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it. For what will it profit a man if he gains the whole world and forfeits his soul? Or what shall a man give in return for his soul? For the Son of Man is going to come with his angels in the glory of his Father, and then he will repay each person according to what he has done. Truly, I say to you, there are some standing here who will not taste death until they see the Son of Man coming in his kingdom."

# **Taking Gathered Worship Home**

We are often bound to seeking our own welfare above all else. Sometimes that is expressed through seeking others' interests but not joyfully. We can be compelled to do so for any number of reasons. But Christ calls us to allegience to Him and His interests. In promoting His priorities we find freedom both from our selfish ambition and from slavishly serving others.

Please use the devotional material below each day this week to praise Christ. Ask Jesus to teach us His ways that we may walk in them to accomplish His purposes.

## **Sunday Morning**

READ Philippians 2:19-24; Matthew 6:31-33; First Corinthians 4:14-21; 10:31-11:1; Second Timothy 2:1-6; Matthew 16:24-28. DISCUSS How do examples help us to better follow Christ? What are the dangers of following models of godly behavior? What are the benefits? PRAY "Jesus, help us to be more like Timothy in caring for others in Your name."

### **Sunday Evening**

### Monday

READ Philippians 2:19-24; First Corinthians 4:14-21; 12:12-26. DISCUSS How did Paul encourage those in Corinth to imitate him and Timothy? Why? How did their example help them to see Christ? SERVE by putting someone else's interest *above your own*! MEDITATE on Revelation 1:4b-6. PRAY, "Jesus, thank You for providing godly examples like Paul and Timothy."

## **Tuesday**

READ Philippians 2:19-24; First Corinthians 10:31-11:1. DISCUSS What did Paul seek instead of His own advantage/interests? How are you doing that? Of what do you (we) need to repent? MEDITATE on Revelation 1:4b-6. PRAY, "Lord, enable us to serve Your interests above our own or even others'."

### Wednesday

READ Philippians 2:19-24; Second Timothy 2:1-6; Ephesians 1:3-10. DISCUSS The Holy Spirit points us to the example of Timothy. What examples did He provide Timothy? SERVE Feed, clothe, or care for someone today in Christ's name. MEDITATE on Revelation 1:4b-6. PRAY, "Lord, make us faithful to You & Your Kingdom."

## **Thursday**

READ Philippians 2:19-24; Matthew 16:24-28. DISCUSS How does taking up our cross involve dying to our interests? How does it help us serve others in Christ's name? MEDITATE on Revelation 1:4b-6. PRAY, "Lord, thank You for dying for us."

### Friday

READ Philippians 2:19-24; Matthew 6:31-33; First Corinthians 4:14-21; 10:31-11:1; Second Timothy 2:1-6; Matthew 16:24-28. DISCUSS, How has God been encouraging you from these passages this week? DELIGHT in Christ, knowing that we will be like Him one day! MEDITATE on Revelation 1:4b-6. PRAY for one another at FCCW that we would understand our identity in Christ.

## Saturday

PREPARE today for the worship service tomorrow which is *available both in-person and via live-stream*. READ **Philippians 2:12-30**. Invite others to join you tomorrow for the service. Ask Jesus to gather us together joyfully to praise Him.

# **Revelation 1:4b-6**

Grace to you and peace from Him who is and who was and who is to come, and from the seven spirits who are before His throne, and from Jesus Christ the faithful witness, the firstborn of the dead, and the ruler of kings on earth. To Him who *loves us and has freed us from our sins by His blood and made us a kingdom, priests to His God and Father, to Him be glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen.*
