Responsive Reading

Leader: Which is the seventh commandment?

People: The seventh commandment is, Thou shalt not commit adultery.

Leader: What is required in the seventh commandment?

People: The seventh commandment requires the preservation of our own and our neighbor's chastity, in heart, speech, and behavior.

Leader: What is forbidden in the seventh commandment?

People: The seventh commandment forbids all unchaste thoughts, words, and actions. (Shorter Catechism 70-72)

Corporate Confession of Sin

Leader: We acknowledge our sin to you, O LORD, and do not hide from you our iniquity.

People: We confess that we have been unchaste; we acknowledge all our sins of the flesh and all the excess and extravagance of our whole lives in thoughts, words, and actions.

Leader: We have not remained pure ourselves, nor have we preserved our neighbor's purity.

People: Cleanse us, O God of our salvation, and make us pure.

All: Hear our prayer of confession, and forgive the guilt of our sins.
