"8 For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, 9 not of works, lest anyone should boast."

C. TEXT: Psalm 145:1-21 (Pew Bible/Pg. 587/Old Testament)

Psalm 145 contains no requests. It is pure praise for God!

CELEBRATE GOD

I. WHEN SHOULD YOU PRAISE GOD? (145:1-2)

- **A.** Praise God willfully (145:1-2).
 - "IBless the LORD, O my soul; And all that is within me, bless His holy name!
 - 2 Bless the LORD, O my soul, And forget not all His benefits:" Psalm 103:1-2

"16 Rejoice always,

17 pray without ceasing,

18 in everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you."

I Thessalonians 5:16-18

- **B.** Praise God continually (145:1-2b).
 - "I will bless the LORD at all times; His praise shall continually be in my mouth." Psalm 34:1
 - "15 Therefore by Him let us continually offer the sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of our lips, giving thanks to His name.

16 But do not forget to do good and to share, for with such sacrifices God is well pleased."

Hebrews 13:15-16

- C. Praise God daily (145:2a).
 - "Blessed be the Lord, Who daily loads us with benefits, The God of our salvation! Selah"

II. HOW SHOULD YOU PRAISE GOD? (145:3-20)

A. Praise God for His greatness (vs 3-6).

"Oh, the depth of the riches both of the wisdom and knowledge of God! How unsearchable are His judgments and His ways past finding out!"

Romans 11:33

"Ah, Lord God! Behold, You have made the heavens and the earth by Your great power and outstretched arm. There is nothing too hard for You."

Jeremiah 32:17

B. Praise God for His goodness (vs 7-10).

"Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and comes down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow of turning." James 1:17

"Or do you despise the riches of His goodness, forbearance, and longsuffering, not knowing that the goodness of God leads you to repentance?"

Romans 2:4

C. Praise God for His glory (vs 11-13).

"3 And I heard a loud voice from heaven saying, "Behold, the tabernacle of God is with men, and He will dwell with them, and they shall be His people. God Himself will be with them and be their God. 4 And God will wipe away every tear from their eyes; there shall be no more death, nor sorrow, nor crying. There shall be no more pain, for the former things have passed away."
