To win, you must know your enemy! To be ignorant of yourself or your enemy always places yourself in danger!

Many of the seventeenth-century Puritans also emphasized the importance of knowing the enemy and his tactics when they approached the subject of spiritual warfare. For instance, in his Precious Remedies against Satan's Devices, Thomas Brooks highlighted "the essentials" of spiritual warfare: "Christ, the Scripture, your own hearts, and Satan's devices, are the four prime things that should be first and most studied and searched. If any cast off the study of these, they cannot be safe here, nor happy hereafter." (Nicholas Batzig)

Dire issues in our day:

- 1) Wisdom that is timeless, tested & true.
- 2) Self-control in the face of opposition.
- 3) Vigilant Watching & a holy violence for holiness.
- 4) Sober-mindedness, self-control & fleeing from immorality.
- 5) Warnings of the sureness & nearness of hell.
- Remember: For the gate is wide and the way is broad that leads to destruction, and there are many who enter through it. (Matthew 7.13)

#### **III. THE DEATH (24-27)**

  - 3. **looked ahead** to see the terrible consequences of his sin (26-27)

### 2 ways of application:

1. Unbelieving, habitual sexual sinner (loves/lives in sin)

2. Believing, struggling Christian (battling, trapped, ashamed, guilt-laden)

Christ did not die to make good works merely possible or to produce a half-hearted pursuit. He died to produce in us a passion for good deeds. Christian purity is not the mere avoidance of evil, but the pursuit of good (John Piper).

The chief weapon we ought to use in resisting Satan is the Bible. Three times the great enemy offered temptations to our Lord. Three times his offer was refused, with a text of Scripture as the reason, "it is written" (Mt. 3:4, 7, 10). (JC Ryle)

"It is written." Stand upon it, and if the devil were fifty devils in one, he could not overcome you. On the other hand, if you leave "It is written," Satan knows more about reasoning than you do. He is far older, has studied mankind very thoroughly, and knows all our weak points. Therefore, the contest will be an unequal one. Do not argue with him but wave in his face the banner of God's Word. Satan cannot endure the infallible truth, for it is death to the falsehood of which he is the father. (CH Spurgeon)
