Grown-Ups In The Room Pt.7: "We Should All Be Crying On Sunday."

**I Text:**

Old Covenant: *Jeremiah 9:17-26*

New Covenant: *1Peter 1:22-25*

**II Doctrine:** All Christians must not grieve the Holy Spirit, but strive to please him in the way we conduct ourselves. By the power of the Holy Ghost we should love one another the way Christ commanded us. This is evidence that we have been born again from above. We are all here for a limited time and must not glory in our worldly strengths. We should glory in our relationship with God, and knowledge of His word. The Gospel message encompasses the fulfillment of all the Covenants in the Bible. We must not be afraid, but weep for the enemies of the Gospel.

**III Comparing Scripture With Scripture:**
