Prelude

Call to Worship

This psalm exhorts us to "say" that the Lord is good and that His love endures forever. The rest of it is a rehearsal of specific examples of various experiences of God's people bearing this out, thus demonstrating that what we say about God, our testimony, must be based on our experience as God's people.

Psalm 107 ESV

- Oh give thanks to the LORD, for he is good, for his steadfast love endures forever!
- ² Let the redeemed of the LORD say so, whom he has redeemed from trouble
- 3 and gathered in from the lands,

from the east and from the west, from the north and from the south.

- 4 Some wandered in desert wastes,
 - finding no way to a city to dwell in;
- 5 hungry and thirsty,

their soul fainted within them.

- ⁶Then they cried to the LORD in their trouble, and he delivered them from their distress.
- 7 He led them by a straight way till they reached a city to dwell in.

22 And let them offer sacrifices of thanksgiving, and tell of his deeds in songs of joy!

23 Some went down to the sea in ships, doing business on the great waters;

24 they saw the deeds of the LORD,

his wondrous works in the deep.

25 For he commanded and raised the stormy wind, which lifted up the waves of the sea.

²⁶ They mounted up to heaven; they went down to the depths; their courage melted away in their evil plight;

27 they reeled and staggered like drunken men and were at their wits' end.

²⁸ Then they cried to the LORD in their trouble, and he delivered them from their distress.

29 He made the storm be still,

and the waves of the sea were hushed.

30 Then they were glad that the waters were quiet, and he brought them to their desired haven.

31 Let them thank the LORD for his steadfast love, for his wondrous works to the children of man!

32 Let them extol him in the congregation of the people, and praise him in the assembly of the elders.

33 He turns rivers into a desert,

springs of water into thirsty ground,

34 a fruitful land into a salty waste,

because of the evil of its inhabitants.

- 36 And there he lets the hungry dwell, and they establish a city to live in;
- 37 they sow fields and plant vineyards and get a fruitful yield.
- 38 By his blessing they multiply greatly, and he does not let their livestock diminish.
- 39 When they are diminished and brought low through oppression, evil, and sorrow,
- 40 he pours contempt on princes and makes them wander in trackless wastes;
- 41 but he raises up the needy out of affliction and makes their families like flocks.
- 42 The upright see it and are glad, and all wickedness shuts its mouth.
- 43 Whoever is wise, let him attend to these things; let them consider the steadfast love of the LORD.

This should come as no surprise, since God's people are united to Christ, identified with Him, and are His body, executing deeds of mercy on His behalf to all nations, especially through His Great Commission.

We confess together the sin that hamstrings our consistent and powerful witness.

Corporate Confession: Almighty and merciful God, Who loved the world and gave your only begotten Son to purchase a bride for Him, extending mercy to people from every tongue, language, and nation, and Who has committed to us the message of reconciliation, we confess our cowardice, slothfulness, and lack of love in failing to fulfill your commission to us with wholehearted zeal and resolve. When we should have spoken in testimony of your work, we have been silent. When we should have trusted in your protection, we have been fearful. When we should have been moved by the brokenness, misery, and need all around us, we have been callous and indifferent to the effects of sin on those we know. We humbly ask your forgiveness for the sake of Christ, and beseech your power and grace to make us henceforth your bold witnesses, testifying to both your justice and your love, so that the earth might be filled with the knowledge of you, and that your kingdom might come in all of its fullness and blessing, for Christ's sake, and because we pray in His name. Amen.

Distribution of Elements

Because we believe that wine was used in the Last Supper and is thus more in accord with the fullness of symbolism intended by God in the Lord's Supper, we offer wine and encourage those who take part in Communion to take this. For those with conscientious convictions against the use of wine, however, we offer the option of grape juice, which is contained in the inner circle of the communion trays. The cups containing wine are in the outer circles of the trays.

⁸ And the four living creatures, each of them with six wings, are full of eyes all around and within, and day and night they never cease to say, "Holy, holy, holy, is the Lord God Almighty, who was and is and is to come!" And whenever the living creatures give glory and honor and thanks to him who is seated on the throne, who lives forever and ever, to the twenty-four elders fall down before him who is seated on the throne and worship him who lives forever and ever. They cast their crowns before the throne, saying, it "Worthy are you, our Lord and God, to receive glory and honor and power, for you created all things, and by your will they existed and were created."
