John 6; Lord's Day 33

TRUE CONVERSION: QUICKENING THE NEW MAN

- I. With difficulty.
 - A. The difficulty is because regeneration is only of the heart (new man) and all the rest of us remains totally depraved (old man).
 - 1. Our natural understanding is in complete darkness (Eph. 5:8).
 - 2. Our natural affections are completely corrupt.
 - 3. And our natural will is totally perverse.
 - B. To overcome this nature, Almighty God performs a powerful, supernatural, irresistible work drawing us to Himself (John 6:44).
 - 1. The Father draws irresistibly (not just enabling man to come if he chooses), so all (each and every one) will certainly come.
 - 2. God's drawing us is a work of grace in our heart which influences our mind and will and affections.
- II. Coming to Jesus is an activity of our Spirit-enlightened mind, by a repeated renewing of our mind (Eph. 4:23; Rom. 12:2).
 - A. A knowledge of Jesus Christ is essential, for we do not move toward an unknown object.
 - 1. Notice that coming to Jesus is by being "taught of God" (John 6:45,65).
 - 2. This teaching is the gospel given in and based on Scripture.
 - 3. The external teaching must be accompanied by the Spirit regenerating, enlightning the mind and inclining the will.
 - B. The mind is enlightened to know Him as our Savior and our Lord who owns and commands us.
 - 1. We believe that He is and that He is the rewarder to those who diligently seek Him (Heb. 11:6).
 - 2. When we turn away from ourselves and the world, and then we look to Him as our Hope and Portion, our Resting place.
- III. Coming to Jesus is an activity of our affections and will
 - A. It is a casting of self on Jesus for salvation, because I see Him, by faith, as the only Source of salvation.
 - B. And then we come to Jesus as an act of our will, surrendering our will to Him.
 - 1. We submit to His government, yield to His scepter, heed His commandments in all good works.
 - 2. We count all things but loss for the excellency of the knowledge our Savior.
 - C. Where faith gives sight, the affections are warmed with love to embrace the object of our faith (Heb. 11:13).
 - God draws us with bands of love (Hosea 11:4), telling us of His boundless and infinite love.
 - 2. Jesus is precious to those who believe in Him (I Peter 2:7) so precious that we will deny ourselves.
- IV. In the way of coming to Jesus we gain the assurance of salvation.
 - A. Jesus assures those who come to Him that they will forever remain His.
 - B. Their salvation is certain: shall not be cast out.
