ORDER OF WORSHIP

Thank you for joining us this morning! At Christ the King, our worship is a divine-human dialogue, in accordance with Scriptural example and precedent, alternatively hearing God's Word and responding in prayer, song, or meditation. The gray boxes throughout the bulletin were written to aid each worshipper in thoughtful and meaningful participation in this dialogue. Please prepare your heart by reading through the bulletin, praying for those leading and worshipping around you, and silencing all communication devices.

We encourage parents to involve children as soon as possible in the worship service. In consideration of other worshippers, we request parents with children not yet ready for unobtrusive participation in worship to utilize the nursery or, if necessary, the cry room. A nursery is available for children ages 3 months to 3 years during all Sunday morning activities.

Prelude

Call to Worship

Notice that in our call to worship today the rationales for praising God are both that He has worked salvation throughout the earth and that He will judge the world in righteousness. It is the fact of His wonderful, mighty salvation acts that these two complementary truths can be reconciled and rejoiced in equally by His people.

Psalm 98 ESV

Oh sing to the LORD a new song, for he has done marvelous things! His right hand and his holy arm have worked salvation for him.

²The LORD has made known his salvation:

he has revealed his righteousness in the sight of the nations.

We AcknoWLedge Our Sin

* Reading from the Law

It is confidence in the pardoning grace of God that encourages us both to acknowledge and to forsake our sin. Notice also that there is an admonition here that indicates that the offer of God's mercy has a time limit. Persistent rebellion invites God's eventual fearful judgment.

Isaiah 55:6, 7 ESV 6 Seek the LORD while he may be found; call upon him while he is near; 7 let the wicked forsake his way, and the unrighteous man his thoughts; let him return to the LORD, that he may have compassion on him, and to our God, for he will abundantly pardon.

Silent Confession of Sin

Corporate Confession of Sin

Notice that there is in this confession of sin both a reliance upon the mercy of God flowing from the acknowledgment of need and a confidence in the psalmists basic attitude of devotion and covenant faithfulness, which gives him (and us!) hope.

Assurance of Pardoning Grace

We can either try to cover our sin ourselves (by denying it) or confess our sins, thus trusting in the covering that God provides.

I John 1:8, 9 ESV

8 If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. 9 If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

* Hymn of Assurance

As our sermon text for today indicates (v. 7), God is a refuge (a "hiding place") for those who trust in Him in their brokenness, neediness, and sin. Thus He, and only He, is the answer to the weariness and sorrow that come to us because of our sin. Tell him about that today and express your gratitude to the Lover of your soul.

The Apostles' Creed

Distribution of Elements

Because we believe that wine was used in the Last Supper and is thus more in accord with the fullness of symbolism intended by God in the Lord's Supper, we offer wine and encourage those who take part in Communion to take this. For those with conscientious convictions against the use of wine, however, we offer the option of grape juice, which is contained in the inner circle of the communion trays. The cups containing wine are in the outer circles of the trays.
