PAUL AND THE MISSION OF THE SERVANT OF THE LORD

INTRODUCTION

- 1. Recent survey of Acts 1-15. Apostles obeyed Lk 25:46-48.
- 2. A 15 is historical pivot pt in Acts. Gospel goes to all nations missionary journeys of Paul churches, courts, prison -> Rome.
- 3. Connect Paul's ministry to Isaiah's prophecy re: Servant of YHWH.

1st: Paul: the Pivot of Redemptive History

- 1. Paul's sense of his own apostolic stewardship declaring fulfillment of much wh/ constituted the eschatological hope of an OT believer.
- 2. cf. 1C 10:11 we are those *upon whom the ends of the ages have come*. In 2C 3, he compares his ministry w/ that of Moses!
- **3**. Paul's *mystery*: what was previously not revealed [OT] now revealed [NT]
 - i. R = 16:25-27 mystery now manifest = pivot in redemptive history
 - ii. Eph 3:1-12 see same themes related to making the mystery known
- 4. We participate in the pivotal event of the gospel of the death & res of Jesus

2nd: Paul and the Servant of the Lord

- 1. Paul's sermon in A 13 Davidic Covenant Jesus the Messiah.
- 2. Decisive rejection by Jewish hearers -> pivot to Gentile hearers A 13:44-48
 - i. v45 despite warning of Hab 1:5, contradict & blaspheme
 - ii. v46 Paul & Barn recognize pivot to Jew 1st & also Grk [R 1:16].
 - iii. why? v47 cites Isa 49:6 = Paul's mission wh/ is mission of the Servant. Paul is identified w/ the Servant & advances His mission.

3rd: The Servant of the Lord

- 1. Isa 40-55 Israel called to be YHWH's Servant but failed. YHWH to send His Servant: identity individual & corporate; mission to Israel & nations
- 2. <u>Isa 42:1-9</u> spoken by Father at Jesus' baptism the Servant is identified.
- 3. <u>Isa 49:1-6</u> Paul cites v6 in A 13. Servant complains: ministry to Israel is for nothg but is assured that He will be a light for the preserved ones of Israel & of the nations extends boundary of "Israel" to end of earth.
- 4. Servant is called to suffer [50:4-11] & esp'ly Isa 53 [Lk 22:37 & A 8]

5. Profile of Servant ends w/ suffering wh/ issues into resurrection victory.

4th: Jesus is The Servant of the Lord

- 1. We have already seen that Jesus is Isaiah's Servant of YHWH.
- 2. Paul understood the 2-stage nature of Servant's mission: 1st in His life, death & res; 2nd thru His Spirit international church until 2nd coming.
- 3. Paul presents Jesus as Servant R 15:4-13.
 - i. Unified worship of converts from Judaism & paganism in NCov
 - ii. v8 Jesus servant to the circumcision [Jews] & v9 to gentiles
 - iii. v9 = cites Ps 18:49; v10 = Dt 32:43; v12 = Isa 11:10. Paul preaches Christ from Pss, Law & Prophets [as directed in Lk 24:44]
 - iV. v13 concerns *hope* [2x] in promises cited in v9-12 wh/ we joyfully believe in power of HS that is, the power of resurrected Jesus.
- 4. Jesus is the Servant whose resurrection victory is preached to ends of earth

5th: Paul and the Mission of the Servant of the Lord

- 1. A 13:46-48 Paul also understands that he is to preach *to the end of earth* as apostle of the Servant of YHWH Jesus & Israel of God.
- 2. Jesus accomplished the mission of the Servant in death & resurrection but the mission to extend salvation to end of earth is given to apostles.
- 3. The redemption of Israel of God has begun Jesus builds His church.
- **4.** All according to promises of OT. [Chris Wright, *Mission of God*, 521]. The salvation of God's Israel is the salvation of the world.
- **5**. A 7 & 13 two overviews of redemptive history locate church in history.
- 6. Paul before Jewish Kg Agrippa A 26:22-23

6th: The NCov Church is the Israel of God

- 1. Nations brought into "Israel" to form eschatological Israel <u>Isa 19:19-25</u>
- 2. In Christ, we are one new man [humanity] Ab's seed remnant from OCov Israel & from Gentile paganism 1 olive tree & one Redeemer who has come from Zion & thus [in this way] all Israel shall be saved [R 11:26].
- **3.** Prophecies & promises of OT are fulfilled in Jesus in whom we are *saved:* forgiven, justif'd, adopted, sanctif'd, res'd into eternal glory. Rv 5:9-14.
