The Firstfruits of a New Creation - James 1:13-18

INTRODUCTION

- If God sovereignly controls and designs our particular trials to bring us to wholeness, if at whatever point we fail, can we blame God?
- Isn't He somehow responsible for our sin if He put the possibility for it in the first place? After all, He is the one who allowed it.
- Transition by James from "trials" to "temptations"
- Same root word, but the former is expressed by James by a noun (peirasmos) and the latter a verb (peiradzo)
 - In James' use, the first is a *situation of testing* to reveal character, the second an active attempt to *lure to sin*
 - (the vocabulary is not always as clear cut in other usages of these terms in NT)

TEMPTATION'S EVIL WORK (13-14)

Let no one say when he is tempted,
"I am being tempted by God,"
for God cannot be tempted with evil,
and he himself tempts no one.

But each person is tempted when he is lured and enticed by *his own* desire.

Then desire when it has conceived gives birth to sin, and sin when it is fully grown brings forth death.
