 - **a)** The Figure of the Flood, particularly symbolizing salvation (Gen 7:14-24).

 - **4)** The biblical answer from the Reformed Church: Be resolved to the will of God and make diligent use of the appointed means of grace (*WCF xxv111.6*)

 - **b)** To parents of children who have yet to profess faith in Christ
 - c) To baptized children
 - 3) Have a clear conscience before God!
 - **4)** Look forward to Christ's return and the resurrection!
 - 5) Let our making use of the first sacrament aid our making use of the second!
 - **a)** Do not merely look to the sign, but to what is signified in the sacrament.
 - **b)** Make diligent use of the sacraments according to their proper purpose.
 - **c)** Look to the hope that you have in Christ at the resurrection.
