I. The Glory of His Patience

- A. The Names of God's patience in Scripture
 - 1. Longsuffering: Ex. 34:6; Num. 14:18, 22; 1 Peter 3:20
 - 2. Slow to anger (defer my anger): Ps. 103:8-10; Is. 48:9
 - 3. Keeping silent: Ps. 50:21
 - 4. Not easily provoked: 1 Cor. 13:5
 - 5. Forbearance: Rom. 2:4; Jer. 2:13, 23-25; Matt. 21:33-41; Luke 13:6-9
- B. Misconceptions of God's patience exposed
 - 1. Is His delay in responding to our evil like our delayed response?
 - Ps. 50:21 These things hast thou done and I kept silence; thou thoughtest that I was altogether such an one as thyself.
 - 2. Is His delay in fulfilling His promises like us?
 - 2 Peter 3:9 The Lord is not slack concerning his promise, as some men count slackness; but is longsuffering to us-ward, not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance. (Is. 5:3-4)
 - 3. Is His patience with us sinners because He is partially to be blamed?
 - Jer. 12:1 Righteous are thou, O LORD. (Jer. 9:24)
 - 4. Is His patience with sin like us because He is ignorant of the facts?
 - Heb. 4:13 Neither is there any creature that is not manifest in His sight: but all things are naked and opened unto the eyes of Him with whom we have to do. (Job 34:21-25; Luke 6:8)
 - 5. Is His patience with sin because He doesn't have power, wisdom or courage to respond to sin and therefore, like us, ignores is?
 - Job 9:4. 19 He is wise in heart, and mighty in strength: who hath hardened himself against him, and hath prospered? If I speak of strength, lo, he is strong: and if of judgment, who shall set me a time to plead? Job 9:4-12; 1Chron. 29:11-12
 - 6. Is His patience with sinners because He cannot do without him or her or fears our angry response?
 - Isaiah 17:12-13 Woe to the multitude of many people, which make

a noise like the noise of the seas (...) The nations shall rush like the rushing of many waters: but God shall rebuke them, and they shall flee far off, and shall be chased as the chaff of the mountains before the wind, and like a rolling thing before the whirlwind. (Ps. 93:1, 4; 114:7)

- C. What is then the glorious magnificence of His patience?
 - 1. God's patience is not just the delay execution of His judgments
 - 2. His patience is God's power over Himself
 - a. Numbers 14:15-25 (especially vs. 17 & 21)
 - The power of God is more manifested in His patience to a multitude of sinners than it could be in creating millions of worlds out of nothing: for creating worlds is power over things; patience is power over Himself. (Charnock)
 - b. Nahum 1:1-3; Prov. 16:32
