## Introduction: WHY THE BOOK AND THE LETTERS **Revelation 1**

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Either during reign of Nero, in mid 60s (before 70 AD), or Domitian, end of 1<sup>st</sup> century

Persecution is heating up, as well as two other pressures upon

the Church that will continue until His Return:	
A persecution	
B deception	
C of the world Sexual immorality Materialism	
These are pictured in Revelation as:	
A. Beast from the Sea: Persecution	
B. Beast from the Land Deception	
C. Harlot of Babylon Seduction	
In such a situation, Jesus wants to strip away all deceptions, show you Reality, and encourage you with the Final Outcome.  Why this book is called "Revelation" (1:1)	
It is the Revelation of (1:1)	
From Him – and about Him	
A. From Him: He is speaking. Particularly chs 2-3	

B. About Him: 1:5-8; 12-18; entire book

## III. It is a revelation to the Church

A. To His servants: 1:1

B. To the 7 churches of Asia Minor named in 1:11

Particular personal messages to each of them in chs 2-3

We would have Him address individual Christians. But He addresses the churches corporately.  $\rightarrow$  Q: What church are you part of?

Also these are churches of cities: why One Voice is so important

Note v19-20:

The 7 Stars = 7 angels/messengers, or pastors?

The 7 Lampstands = 7 churches (lights to their communities)

Do you ever think of CPC as one of God's lights to Howard Co.?

The letters from Jesus to His churches in chs 2-3 follow a sevenfold pattern (7 Cs):

- 1. Church named
- 2. Characteristics of the One speaking with authority
- 3. Commendations to the church for encouragement
- 4. Criticisms that call for repentance
- Counsel on what to do
- 6. Consequences promised to the Overcomers (and/or to Disobedient)
- 7. Call to Heed!

We do well to pray this week to have ears to **hear** and **obey** (1:3) what Jesus has to say to Columbia Presbyterian in the weeks ahead before we move into the next major stage of ministry.
