

- A. The second half of the book of Daniel, like the first, is prophecy.
- B. The vision recorded in our text gives us a bird's eye view of all history.

Daniel: God's Antithetical, Indestructible, Triumphant Kingdom (9) The Four Beasts Judged & Destroyed

I. Men's Kingdoms: Beastly.

- A. What Daniel saw in the first part of his dream was terrible; it troubled and alarmed him.

- B. The fundamental point of the vision is also a terrifying reality: men's kingdoms are beastly.

II. God's Judgment: Final.

- A. Also inducing fear, though now the fear of reverence in the heart of believers, was Daniel's spectacle of God.

- B. Comforting it is, that this God sat in judgment on the beasts, and destroyed them finally.

III. Christ's Kingdom: Everlasting.

- A. In the way of the destruction of the beasts and their kingdoms, God raises up the full perfection of the everlasting kingdom of Jesus Christ.

- B. In this kingdom, the saints of the Most High have a sure place!
