**a. The focus (v. 12a)—saints (from their being) doing the work of the ministry**

**b. The function (v. 12b)**—edifying the body of Christ

**c. The goal**—everyone coming to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ;

**d. The purpose (vv. 14-15)**—no longer children, but growing disciples

**e. The result (v. 16)**—a growing vital organism, at its essence the body of Christ, marked by loving edification

**16** from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by what every joint supplies, according to the effective working by which every part does its share, causes growth of the body for the edifying of itself in love.



In the Lord's Supper we "declare" the body and blood of Christ.

By partaking of the Lord's Supper we assert that we are, by grace through faith, His body—the church.





And from BEING comes redemptive,  
effectual DOING.

And from redemptive, effectual DOING  
comes HAVING the desires of your heart  
relative to God's will for you, your family,  
your loved ones and friends, and  
especially the church body of which you  
have been made a part.
