Why Classical Education?

Classical Education Organizes your brain for learning.

Imagine your <u>brain</u> being like a room with no closet, no <u>shelving</u>, no <u>dressers</u> and no <u>drawers</u>.

You start <u>filling</u> that room with stuff. <u>Where</u> are you going to put that stuff? --- In <u>piles on the floor</u>. That's the place you've got.

And, what happens when you run out of floor space? Then, where do you put your stuff.

You pile it on top of the piles that are already on the floor.

What do you need to get this room organized?

You need a place to put your stuff...so that it's not just one big pile of mixed up stuff.

You need a closet, drawers, a book shelf. You need shelving, drawers and organizers.

And... SO DOES YOUR BRAIN!!!

You learn the core subjects: Math, Science, History, Geography, etc.

You learn the key vocabulary that goes with each of those subjects.

The **core subjects** are the **dressers**. The <u>vocabulary</u> words are the **drawers**.

The <u>Grammar Stage</u> of the **Trivium**, stage 1, <u>organizes</u> your brain so that you have <u>places</u> to put all the information that you are going to learn in school.

This helps with the <u>memory</u> and <u>retrieval</u> of information.

If your room looked like this (messy room), **how long** do you think it would take to <u>find</u> that <u>special shirt</u> you are looking for? --- It could be <u>awhile</u>. People with <u>messy</u> rooms <u>waste</u> so much time trying to <u>find</u> things, and <u>sometimes</u> they <u>never</u> do.

But what if your room looked like this (clean room)? – Pretty <u>quick</u>, eh. You go to the <u>dresser</u> where your clothes are. You open the drawer where your shirts are, and there it is.

Similarly, **if your brain is organized**, you will <u>remember</u> information better and you'll be able to <u>find</u> that information in your brain when you need it.
