Of Providence. 5.** The most wise, righteous, and gracious God doth oftentimes leave, for a season, His own children to manifold temptations, and the corruption of their own hearts, to chastise them for their former sins, or to discover unto them the hidden strength of corruption and deceitfulness of their hearts, that they may be humbled; and, to raise them to a more close and constant dependence for their support upon Himself, and to make them more watchful against all future occasions of sin, and for sundry other just and holy ends.

**WLC Q. 105.** What are the sins forbidden in the first commandment? A. The sins forbidden in the first commandment are...discontent and impatience at his dispensations, charging him foolishly for the evils he inflicts on us; and ascribing the praise of any good we either are, have or can do, to fortune, idols, ourselves, or any other creature. **WLC Q. 12.** What are the decrees of God? A. God's decrees are the wise, free, and holy acts of the counsel of his will, whereby, from all eternity, he hath, for his own glory, unchangeably fore-ordained whatsoever comes to pass in time, especially concerning angels and men. **WLC Q. 147.** What are the duties required in the tenth commandment? A. The duties required in the tenth commandment are, such a full contentment with our own condition...**WLC Q. 193.** What do we pray for in the fourth petition? A.
