"Paul Transferred Under Heavy Guard"

Acts 23: 23 - 35

²³ Then he called two of the centurions and said, "Get ready two hundred soldiers, with seventy horsemen and two hundred spearmen to go as far as Caesarea at the third hour of the night. ²⁴ Also provide mounts for Paul to ride and bring him safely to Felix the governor." ²⁵ And he wrote a letter to this effect:

²⁶ "Claudius Lysias, to his Excellency the governor Felix, greetings. ²⁷ This man was seized by the Jews and was about to be killed by them when I came upon them with the soldiers and rescued him, having learned that he was a Roman citizen. ²⁸ And desiring to know the charge for which they were accusing him, I brought him down to their council. ²⁹ I found that he was being accused about questions of their law, but charged with nothing deserving death or imprisonment. ³⁰ And when it was disclosed to me that there would be a plot against the man, I sent him to you at once, ordering his accusers also to state before you what they have against him."


³¹ So the soldiers, according to their instructions, took Paul and brought him by night to Antipatris. ³² And on the next day they returned to the barracks, letting the horsemen go on with him. ³³ When they had come to Caesarea and delivered the letter to the governor, they presented Paul also before him. ³⁴ On reading the letter, he asked what province he was from. And when he learned that he was from Cilicia, ³⁵ he said, "I will give you a hearing when your accusers arrive." And he commanded him to be guarded in Herod's praetorium.

Paul Transferred Under Heavy Guard

1. Tribune Carries Out His Duty to Safeguard Prisoner (23-25).

2. Tribune Deftly Covers His Own Tracks (26-30).

3. Everyone Here Is Shown Doing Their Duty (31-35).

CONCLUSION: Jesus is orchestrating His Kingdom's expansion on earth through His people certainly, but He also has total control over all other kingdoms, including Rome. He is the One, after all, who has entrusted the sword to governors and kings to administer His justice for the time being. Here even with the fallen sinfulness of self-serving rulers, we see justice being safeguarded with Paul receiving protection and appropriate due process of the law. King Jesus is able to bring about justice regardless of man's machinations. Let us trust Him as we seek to peacably testify to His resurrection.

Romans 13:1-7

"Let every person be subject to the governing authorities. For there is no authority except from God, and those that exist have been instituted by God. ² Therefore whoever resists the authorities resists what God has appointed, and those who resist will incur judgment. ³ For rulers are not a terror to good conduct, but to bad. Would you have no fear of the one who is in authority? Then do what is good, and you will receive his approval, ⁴ for he is God's servant for your good. But if you do wrong, be afraid, for he does not bear the sword in vain. For he is the servant of God, an avenger who carries out God's wrath on the wrongdoer. ⁵ Therefore one must be in subjection, not only to avoid God's wrath but also for the sake of conscience. ⁶ For because of this you also pay taxes, for the authorities are ministers of God, attending to this very thing. ⁷ Pay to all what is owed to them: taxes to whom taxes are owed, revenue to whom revenue is owed, respect to whom respect is owed, honor to whom honor is owed."

Second Timothy 4:1-5

I charge you in the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to judge the living and the dead, and by his appearing and his kingdom: preach the word; be ready in season and out of season; reprove, rebuke, and exhort, with complete patience and teaching. For the time is coming when people will not endure sound teaching, but having itching ears they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own passions, and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander off into myths. As for you, always be sober-minded, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist, fulfill your ministry.

Matthew 22:15-22

Then the Pharisees went and plotted how to entangle him in his words. And they sent their disciples to him, along with the Herodians, saying, "Teacher, we know that you are true and teach the way of God truthfully, and you do not care about anyone's opinion, for you are not swayed by appearances. Tell us, then, what you think. Is it lawful to pay taxes to Caesar, or not?" But Jesus, aware of their malice, said, "Why put me to the test, you hypocrites? Show me the coin for the tax." And they brought him a denarius. And Jesus said to them, "Whose likeness and inscription is this?" They said, "Caesar's." Then he said to them, "Therefore render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's." When they heard it, they marveled. And they left him and went away.

PRAY, "Lord, Your authority alone is complete. Thank You for ruling and reigning over all things even now. Teach us to trust Your sovereignty and to submit to Your Word joyfully."

Wednesday

READ Acts 23:23-35; Revelation 1:4-8; Psalm 135:1-21. DISCUSS, How does God compare to the kings of the nations? Why do we doubt Him? How are you turning from your rebellion against Him today? MEDITATE on Matthew 4:17. PRAY "Lord, forgive us for resisting You. Teach us to submit to You completely in all our ways. Allow us to humble ourselves before You."

Thursday

READ Acts 23:23-35; Matthew 22:15-22; Romans 13:1-7. DISCUSS, What are we supposed to give to Caesar? What are we to give to God? What is the difference? Which are you wrestling with today? MEDITATE on Matthew 4:17. PRAY "Father, make us as submissive and joyful as Jesus was in submitting to You coming to save us. Holy Spirit, embolden us to witness to Christ."

Friday

READ Acts 23:23-35; Romans 13:1-7; Second Timothy 4:1-5; Revelation 1:4-8; Matthew 22:15-22. DISCUSS, How has God been teaching you from these passages this week? REJOICE if Christ has given you the honor to be identified among His people! MEDITATE on Matthew 4:17. PRAY for renewal and revival across our land.

Saturday

PREPARE today for the worship service tomorrow. *There will be both the in-person and live-stream services available*. READ **Acts 24:1-27**; **Job** chapters **38-41**. Invite others to join you for either *in-person or live-stream service* tomorrow. Ask Jesus to be glorified in our testimony of Him.
