Resenting God's Generosity

Matthew 20:1-16

- I. GOD'S GRACIOUS CHARACTER—Beautifully Righteous
 - A. God is Just. (2, 4, 13)—He does what is right by everyone.
 - **1.** He does what is <u>fair</u>. (4)—God never cheats or takes advantage of anybody.
 - **2.** He keeps His word. (2, 13)—He delivers on the promises He makes.
 - B. God is Sovereign. (14-15a)—He can do what He wants with what is His.
 - 1. Everything is His.
 - 2. He may distribute it as He chooses.
 - C. <u>God is Patient</u>. (13)—He graciously engages His inferiors in conversation.
 - 1. He answers. God does not owe us an explanation but he wants us to understand.
 - 2. He offers <u>friendship</u>. He answers gently, calling the man "friend."
 - D. <u>God is Generous</u>. (15b; Jam 1:17)—abundant, surprising, lavish kindness
 - 1. God does not owe us anything. God is pleased to obligate Himself for our benefit.
 - 2. He gives <u>each</u> of us <u>better</u> than we deserve. He pays more than we could earn.
- II. OUR SINFUL NATURE (9-12)— ridiculously, idolatrously self-centered and petty Humanity's orientation in reality went badly astray at the Fall.
 - **A.** <u>We are Ungrateful</u>. (Isa 26:12; 1 Cor 4:7) We have a vastly over-estimated opinion of ourselves, abilities and usefulness to God.
 - **B.** We are Easily Offended. (12) We are trying to find our place and establish our importance by comparing ourselves to *other people*.

C. We are Envious of others. (15b) Self-centered, idolatrous vexation with everything

- 1. <u>Displeasure in God</u> (Mat 22:37-38)—breaking the Greatest Commandment
- 2. <u>Ill-Will toward our Neighbor</u> (Mat 22:39)—breaking 2nd Greatest Commandment
- **3.** <u>Misery to ourselves</u>—nothing even slightly profitable or enjoyable in this sin

III. THE LESSONS OF THE STORY

- A. Salvation is all of Grace. (Rom 3:10, 23) We don't deserve it and we can't earn it.
 - **1.** The Jews and the Gentiles—Jesus opens the kingdom of God to include Johnny-Come-Lately Gentiles.
 - **2.** The Ages of the Church—There is still important work to do, and God is raising up great leaders in every generation.
 - **3.** The Stages of a Person's Life (Heb 3:7, 15; 4:7)—A person may enter the service of God at any age.
- B. We are called to Work. (6-7) It doesn't save us; it is a benefit of being saved.
 - 1. The work itself is a blessing. We are unemployable; God lets us to work for Him!
 - a. Everyone needs a Respectable Job. (something productive to do)
 - **b.** Everyone needs a Meaningful Cause. (something beyond self to serve)
 - 2. Working in God's Vineyard is the best job ever!
 - a. God is the Best Employer.
 - b. Building His kingdom is the Noblest Cause.
